SUMMER FUN!! STAGGERING STATS... During our five-week Summer Reading Program our elementary children read for 49,320 minutes, our middle and high school children collectively read 67 books and our adults read 165 books! We gave away a total of 61 Raffle Prizes, and 231 Prizes were taken from the treasure chest! We also collected 232 book reviews, and 1334 people attended our summer programming and events! Wow... what a great summer it has been so far, and it still isn't over. We have a lighter programming schedule in August, but there is still lots to do at your Lee Library, so check it out!
