





Peep Into My Favorite Book Saturday, April 8 10:30 a.m.—Noon



Dioramas will be displayed at the library! This fun event is for kids in **grades 1-8. Please register.**




Toe Jam Puppet Band Thursday, April 27 10:30 a.m. Lee Public Safety Complex
