


Lee Public Library Bookworm Digest





Artist of the Month

Photographer and Hampton resident Darrell Eifert is our featured artist for the months of November and December. This exhibit marks a bit of a change for him.


Darrell has always been drawn to the light and beauty of landscape and seascape images in the U.K., as well as the stunning interior geometries of classic British cathedrals. Years ago, he met photojournalist Ivan Massar (now deceased) and was amazed by his prints from the streets of Paris in the 1940s. That initial meeting blossomed into a 10-year friendship and included conversations about the unique compositional and observational skills that go into capturing what Cartier-Bresson famously called 'the decisive moment'. This year when Dar-



rell and his wife visited Cambridge and London, he put some of those skills into practice resulting in the street photos that are on display at the library. There is a panoramic image of the London skyline taken from the Greenwich Observatory and several cathedral compositions giving a glimpse of what draws the Eiferts back to the UK again and again.



Join us on Friday mornings for a baby/toddler lapsit! For children up to 2 years of age, this 20 minute program offers songs, stories and move-




ment with relaxed time afterwards for play and socializing! Registration is not required. There will be no Lapsit on Friday, December 30.




