


January/February Artist


Maura Sullivan is an artist who paints with acrylics. Maura was diagnosed with NF2 in her 30s and is deaf and sight impaired as a result of treatment.


Lee resident Michael Ward reads from his newest book "The Colored Folks Ain't Gonna Make It" This is the second book in his *Sketches of Lee* series.






