

How To Check Your Library Account Through the Online Catalog

Our online catalog has many features. Go to <u>leelibrarynh.org</u> and click on Catalog in the salmon-colored bar at the top of the screen. This will bring you to a page where you can log on to your account in the upper right corner using your last name and library card number.

Once you have logged on, you can renew books by clicking on "my items" as long as you renew before the item is due. You can also reserve books and choose authors to watch so that you will be alerted when the library purchases one of their books.


Knitting for 50+ 1st and 3rd Wednesdays 9 a. m.
