Votes for Women: A History of the Suffrage Movement

Presenter: Liz Tentarelli

The campaign for women's right to vote was a long one, from the 1848 Women's Rights Convention in Seneca Falls, New York to ratification of the 19th amendment in 1920. Who were the key players in New Hampshire and the nation? What issues and obstacles did they face? How did suffragists benefit from World War I in the final push for passage of the women's suffrage amendment? Who was left out when women got the right to vote? Using historic photos and documents, Liz Tentarelli will guide us on the journey. Liz is president of the League of Women Voters NH, a non-partisan organization that is the direct descendant of the National American Woman Suffrage Association. 



Future Plans for the Library

The Library Board of Trustees are working on the Renovation and Expansion of the library. Our plan is to renovate the current library and, depending on finances, expand the library with a small addition on the north side of the building. (Upper right side of this drawing)

This plan will allow for an expanded children's area in the front section of the library with space for a librarian's desk, a vestibule for the front door, additional stacks located in the back basement with lift access, and an open concept reading and small group meeting space in the addition.

We hope to feature a three-season deck with comfortable seating to enjoy the natural surroundings and allow access for outdoor programs.

All items returned to the library will remain in quarantine for 72 hours or longer before they are checked in to our system.


