Elizabeth's fiber art wall hangings and sculptures will be on display at the


library September 1through October 31.

Rebecca Rule Moved & Seconded Tuesday, September 13 7 p.m. Jeremiah Smith Grange


Drawing on research from her book, Moved and Seconded: Town Meeting in New Hampshire, the Present, the Past, and the Future,

CPR Wednesday September 7 6 - 8 p.m.


