Wednesday March 5, 6:00pm – 7:00pm – Last of the Granoite State Rattle Snakes, NH Humanities: In partnership with Lee Historical Society: Rattlesnakes were so common in colonial-era New Hampshire that dozens of places were named for them, ranging from the Massachusetts border to the White Mountains. Today, however, *Crotalus horridus*, the timber rattlesnake, is the state's rarest native animal—only a handful are known to survive. State law protects them now, but that may not be enough to save them. Wildlife biologists have predicted this tiny remnant will die out without extraordinary intervention. How did this fascinating animal come to the very brink of extirpation in our state? Held in the Old Town Hall.
