#### **January Book Group**

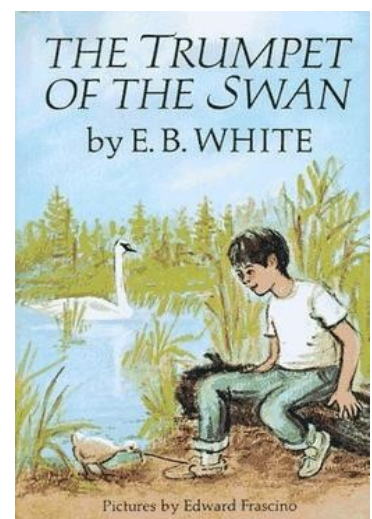
*The Trumpet of the Swan* by E.B. White
