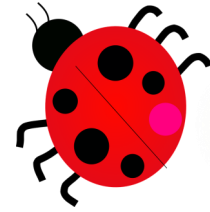

Her mother wants nothing more than for their South Carolina endeavor to fail so they can go back to England. Her family is in danger of losing everything.

Hearing how much the French pay for indigo dye, Eliza believes it's their salvation. 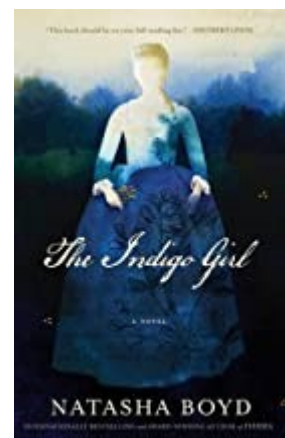

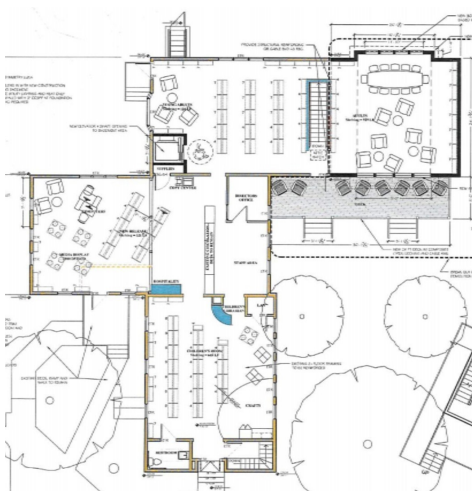
Curbside Pickup is A Breeze

Future Plans for the Library

The Library Board of Trustees are working on the Renovation and Expansion of the library. Our plan is to renovate the current library and, depending on finances, expand the library with a small addition on the north side of the building. (Upper right side of this drawing)
