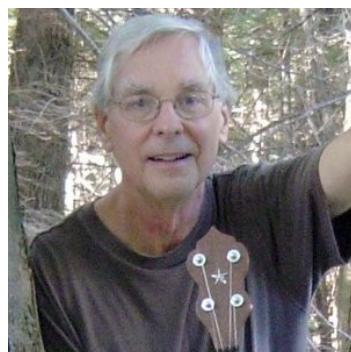


Elizabeth's fiber art wall hangings and sculptures will be on display at the library September 1 through October 31.

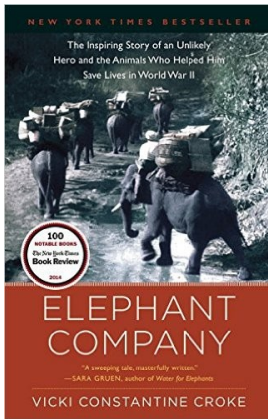

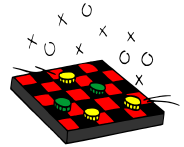
A drop-in group will meet at the September 7 & 21. Help is available from instructor, Donna Kay. All levels welcome.

Story Trekkers

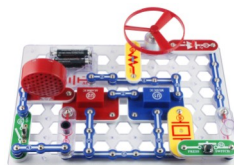

Snap Circuit Week October 3-8

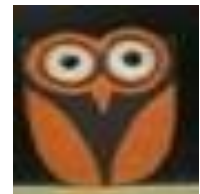
All Ages

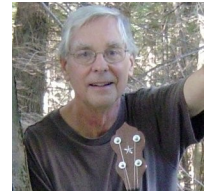

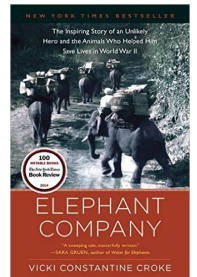
